This way you will be well informed in advance of Mr. Califano's visit. Actual case studies from Memorial Hospital in Charlotte will be used to illustrate and illuminate some of the issues about which Califano will speak. I guarantee you that both your thinking on, and interest in, health issues will be revolutionized.
