PLEASE cooperate with Dawn by not putting anything (data, word processing documents, etc.) on the **RED** AppleShare system disks. Store your stuff on your own disk. The little bit of memory remaining on the system disk is required for use with the applications such as MacWrite, MacPaint, etc. If someone uses this space by leaving their stuff on the system disk, then no one else can use it. So do not use the system unless you have a disk on which to store your work. If you do use these disks for your own material, you risk having your stuff erased.

We have switched to the **RED** AppleShare system disks in order to cut down on their disappearance. It seems that folks accidentally walk out with them. Now it will be more obvious if you make this mistake.
